FLEXIBLE LINES

Flexible hydraulic lines deteriorate inside. The outside of the line may look good, but inside they may be breaking and peeling. The fleximble lines on many of our British Cars have had lots of use and age on them. If they are cracked on the outside, you can just bet that they are breaking up on the inside. I have cut open old lines laterally and have been surprised at how badly deteriorated they were on the inside. The loose pieces can act as a one way valve, allowing fluid to pass only in one direction. This will cause a brake assembly on one wheel to not release after braking. Check those lines for safety's sake.



Rain date will be Sunday March 28. If more info is needed call Charles Coleman, Jaguar Marque Leader at 754-3240.






Memories by Burt Gunter

This isn't really about one of Andrew Lloyd Webber's fine musicals, but about some of our club origins and traditions. The first sports car club in Memphis was the County Shelby Sports Car Club, formed in 1953 or 1954. The reason for the name was that it sounded very British, or European. We held monthly meetings at Robilios



Cafeteria. Our Grille badge was round, with a blue background, red steering wheel, with the letters CSSCC across the top. Susie Anderson and I designed the badge. Bonnie and Knox Everson should guard their badge very carefully, since very few of these are known to exist and I would really like to have one. If anyone has a spare or knows of one, by all means let me know. Some of the members, whose names you may know were Don Horn, Hap Anderson, Cordra York, all owning Jaguar XK 140s, Haines Barnwell, Marshall Robilio had Austin Healy 100s, Earl Sullivan, Burke Cranford had MGs, Bob Mednikow the lone Sunbeam Alpine, Nathan Goff, a Porshe Speedster, and Louis Preato, the mighty Mercedes 300 SL Gullwing. Our events included timed speed events at the Grenada MS and Courtland AL airfields, Rallies in and around Shelby County, and some even ventured to Sebring, FL for the races there. In about 1956 or 1957, we held the Five State Rally. This involved lapsed time, average speeds, checkpoints and even fuel mileage. Our tour began on the bluffs of the Mississippi, through Arkansas, Missouri, Illinois, then south through Kentucky and western Tennessee. In both Arkansas and Missouri we traveled across levees and along mud roads. I remember the floodwaters on Highway 51 South, near Reelfoot Lake, being 8" to 10" deep as it flowed through the floorboards of the Jaguars, MGs and TR3s. Nathan Goffs Porshe Speedster floated off the road more than once. The rally required 12 to 15 hours to complete, if you could endure the mud, water and cold night air. Several of the members had great influence on me, Don Horn, Burke Cranford gave me my love for flying which I learned at the Memphis Flying Service. Nathan Goff taught me to water-ski on McKellar Lake. Most of all the members of CSSCC gave me an appreciation for the kind of sports cars, which I've owned and enjoyed for over 40 years. Our present club was formed in the mid 1970's and continued tradition of Rallies, cookouts and the Best British Car Show I've attended in all my years. Also of interest: the last British car dealer was Small Car Motors, and the German dealer was Dewey Motorcars. Of all the autos I've owned, I love my little British car the best and drive it weekly, and even drive it to Memphis from Atlanta for the annual British Car Show. This past year, I was unable to attend, but was there in spirit. The above photo is my MGB during the Mud Island event several years ago. Thanks to all for the memories !!!




Burt Gunter's first MG in 1956.
