

BSCC Club Members at Road America

Memphian Jimmy Dobbs campaigned his Allard J2 in the Brian Redman International Challange (BRIC) race at Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin's Road America July 18-21. It was great to see the sporty old British hot

rod storming around the twisty and hilly track along with many other historic racers from vintage years. The throaty roar made by the Allard's big US V-8 contrasted brightly with the comparatively high-pitched whine of later, and smaller bore engines. While the Allard was fairly slow into and through the corners, leaped powerfully out and onto Road America's long straights. Remember, you'd be slow into and through corners if you were using the old suspen-



sion technology and drum brakes of the early 1950s! The Allard is pictured here coming out of turn 3 headed into the long downhill that leads to turn 5 and the Toyota bridge we've all seen on ESPN. Jack Reynolds remembers it from a more personal experience.

Dobbs was also seen flogging a vintage Alfa-Romeo coupe in races with some very fast MGBs, Sprites (both Bugeye and box), Midgets, Spitfires, a couple of Saabs (coupe and roadster), along with a host of 356 and early 911 Porsches. The British iron acquitted themselves very well. One of the MGBs was a strong contender in one of the lead spots until it suddenly failed to come around again. It appeared sputtering along in company with an aid van long after the checkered flag after race completion

BSCC members Charles Coleman and Jim Duke were in attendance at the BRIC again this year. Buzz Merchlwitz had planned to enter his Sprite race car until he broke it up in Virginia at an earlier vintage race.

Sir Jack Brabham and Bobby Rahal were there (substituting for Buzz?). Brabham was the honorary track Marshall and drove the pace car for the historic F1 cars in attendance (more than 30 in competition!). Rahal was racing a vintage Indy car.

You owe yourself a trip to vintage racing at Road America sometime. Every kind of historic racer imagionable is there - hosts of Cobras, big Trans Am muscle cars (Mustangs, Camaros, AMXs, etc.), Jaguars from C-Types to E-Types and purpose built racers, the big ground pounding Can Am racers from the 1960s, tons of Porsches of all stripes and vintage, Formula Ford, Formula Atlantic, sports racers like the T series Lolas, everything you can think of. We've even seen old Grand Prix Alfas and Bugattis.





XK engine for a D-Type Jaguar




