You allow four hours for a trip; 3 for repairs and one for driving.


You can unstick a jammed starter in the dark, in the rain, in 5 minutes and don't think it's a big deal.

Photo at right shows E-type Jaguar engine compartment full of Lucas electrical components: Dynamo (generator) can just be seen at upper left, heater fan motor at center above battery, and voltage regulator to right of battery. Note electrical tape installed on regulator wiring in vain attempt to retain smoke essential to proper function of components (once the smoke gets out, the component is junk). Battery (fortunately of domestic manufacture) illustrates quirky positive ground design philosophy peculiar to British Cars of a certain era.
