The soda blasters demonstrated how effective, yet gentle, soda blasting can be. They removed paint, primer and rust from a Bugeye bonnet without harming the chrome trim and glass headlights.

The Hospitality Dinner, under the big tent at the show site, got everyone together Friday night for a great dinner.

Showtime Saturday was a blast! Judging was under the able management of Buzz Merchlewitz, and the results are inside.










